Synopsis



Prologue

In the palace of King Florestan XIV, everyone is celebrating the christening of his daughter, Princess Aurora. Amidst the sweet sounds of harps and violins, the godmother, the Lilac Fairy, appears with her entourage. The kind fairies—Tenderness, Vividness, Generosity, Courage, and Serenity—bless the newborn with their gifts, granting Aurora the finest human qualities.

Suddenly, the master of ceremonies, Catalabutte, announces the arrival of the evil and powerful fairy Carabosse, who was not invited to the celebration. Furious at being excluded, Carabosse predicts that the young Aurora will one day prick her finger on a spindle and fall into an eternal sleep. The Lilac Fairy, however, calms the frightened parents and promises that the forces of good will prevail. She forces Carabosse to leave the palace. To protect Aurora, the King orders all spinning wheels and spindles to be banned throughout the kingdom, under penalty of death.



Act I

Scene 1

In the royal castle, a grand celebration is being prepared for Princess Aurora's 16th birthday. Guests arrive from all corners of the kingdom, including suitors vying for Aurora's hand.

In the midst of the festivities, an old woman in a dark robe appears, presenting Aurora with a spindle. The princess pricks her finger and immediately falls unconscious. The mysterious woman reveals herself to be the triumphant Carabosse, whose dark prophecy has come true.

The Lilac Fairy appears and assures everyone that Aurora will not die but will instead fall into a deep sleep. Only true love can break the spell. Using her magic, the Lilac Fairy places the entire kingdom under a sleeping enchantment, ensuring that Aurora will awaken at the right time.





Act II

Scene 1

A hundred years later, in a magical forest, Prince Desire is hunting with his entourage. The Lilac Fairy appears before the prince, revealing the image of the beautiful Aurora. The prince instantly recognizes her as the girl who has often appeared in his dreams. Enchanted, he begs the Lilac Fairy to help him find her.

Scene 2

Guided by the Lilac Fairy, Prince Desire transitions into the magical world of Aurora, where her kingdom lies hidden in an enchanted sleep. The evil Carabosse and her servants attempt to block his path and prevent him from reaching Aurora. Despite their efforts, the prince overcomes the obstacles and finds Aurora asleep in the castle.

Moved by her beauty, the prince gently kisses Aurora, breaking the spell. Carabosse and her dark magic are destroyed, and the entire kingdom awakens. Aurora and Prince Desire fall deeply in love. The prince asks the King and Queen for Aurora's hand in marriage, and they joyfully agree.

Epilogue

A magnificent wedding is held in the palace to celebrate the union of Aurora and Prince Desire. Among the guests are characters from beloved fairy tales, such as Princess Florina and the Bluebird, the White Cat and Puss-in-Boots, and Little Red Riding Hood and the Wolf. The Fairies of Diamonds, Sapphires, Gold, and Silver present their blessings to the couple, and the Lilac Fairy bestows her final blessing for a long and happy life together.



Sleeping Beauty Composer



Pyotr I. Tchaikovsky

(1840-1893)

Pyotr Il'yich Tchaikovsky was the author of some of the most popular themes in all of classical music. He founded no school, struck out no new paths or compositional methods, and sought few innovations in his works. Yet the power of his best music elevates it to classic status. It was Tchaikovsky's unique melodic charm that could, whether in his Piano Concerto No. 1 or in his ballet *The Nutcracker* or in his tragic last symphony, make the music sound familiar on first hearing.

Tchaikovsky was born into a family of five brothers and one sister. He began taking piano lessons at age four and showed remarkable talent, eventually surpassing his own teacher's abilities. By age nine, he exhibited severe nervous problems, not least because of his overly sensitive nature. The following year, he was sent to St. Petersburg to study at the School of Jurisprudence. The loss of his mother in **1854** dealt a crushing blow to the young Tchaikovsky. In **1859**, he took a position in the Ministry of Justice, but longed for a career in music, attending concerts and operas at every opportunity. He finally began study in harmony with Zaremba in **1861**, and enrolled at the St. Petersburg Conservatory the following year, eventually studying composition with Anton Rubinstein.

In **1866**, the composer relocated to Moscow, accepting a professorship of harmony at the new conservatory, and shortly afterward turned out his First Symphony, suffering, however, a nervous breakdown during its composition. His opera *The Voyevoda* came in **1867-1868** and he began another, *The Oprichnik*, in **1870**, completing it two years later.

In 1869 Tchaikovsky entered into a working relationship with composer Mily Balakirev, leader of *The Five*; the result was Tchaikovsky's first recognized masterpiece, the fantasy-overture *Romeo and Juliet*. Other works were appearing during this time, as well, including the First String Quartet (**1871**), the Second Symphony (**1873**), and the ballet *Swan Lake* (**1875**).

In **1876**, Tchaikovsky traveled to Paris with his brother, Modest, and then visited Bayreuth, where he met Liszt. By **1877**, Tchaikovsky was an established composer. This was the year of *Swan Lake*'s premiere and the time he began work on the Fourth Symphony (**1877-1878**). The period of subsidy by Mme von Meck was abundantly productive for Tchaikovsky with a spate of outstanding compositions, including the *Serenade for Strings* (**1881**), *1812 Overture* (**1882**), and the Fifth Symphony (1888). In both **1888** and **1889**, Tchaikovsky went on European tours as a conductor, meeting Brahms, Grieg, Dvřak, Gounod, and other notable musical figures. *Sleeping Beauty* was premiered in **1890**, and *The Nutcracker* in **1892**, both with success.

Tchaikovsky and Petipa collaborated on The Sleeping Beauty

The Imperial Theatre in St. Petersburg commissioned Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky to compose the score and Marius Petipa to choreograph. This was their first ballet together, leading to iconic works like The Nutcracker and the revival of Swan Lake.

The Sleeping Beauty premiered in 1890

The ballet debuted at the Imperial Mariinsky Theatre in St. Petersburg on January 15, 1890. Initially, it wasn’t an immediate success but received more favorable critiques than Swan Lake. After Tchaikovsky’s death in 1893, the ballet’s popularity soared, with over 200 performances in the following decade.

Performed as Principal Dancer with some of the world's most prestigious companies, including the Mariinsky Theatre, the Bolshoi Theatre, San Francisco Ballet, and Dutch National Ballet, interpreting all leading roles of the classical repertoire.

Collaborated with legendary choreographers, ballet masters, such as Natalia Makarova, Peter Wright, Hans van Manen, Alexei Ratmansk, Rudi van Dantzig, John Neumeier, William Forsythe, Francesco Ventriglia, Patrick de Bana, Aidar Akhmetov, Helgi Tomasson, Ted Brandsen, and more. Founded a successful ballet academy, We Dance Academies, in the United States, Florida, whose students became top laureates at international competitions, such as YAGP World Ballet Competition, Valentina Kozlova International Ballet Competition, Universal Ballet Competition, ADC IBC - Youth International Ballet Competition, and got accepted in professional ballet companies, such as Sarasota Ballet, Orlando Ballet & Washington Ballet.

Established Melbourne City Ballet Theatre, a 501c3 not-for-profit company, producing full-scale ballets such as Swan Lake, The Nutcracker, Cinderella, Sleeping Beauty, and Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs. Melbourne City Ballet Theatre was inspired by the need for a full-time, year-round, performing company whose mission is to bring international ballet stars and professional ballet companies to Brevard County, while also offering young dancers in the local community a unique opportunity to share the stage with professional ballet artists and perform for local audiences. The Board of Directors, along with Artistic Director, Artem Yachmennikov, shared a vision to consistently provide projects, community outreach programs, and classical training that brought ballet and the culture of dance arts to the center of life in Brevard County.

In 2021, founded the We Dance Program, which has since grown into a unique educational platform and a partnership network of 50+ ballet schools across the United States. The program offers opportunities for children aged five and older to perform on major stages and participate in professional productions alongside international ballet artists. This project has become transformative for regional studios in the U.S., opening thousands of new pathways for young dancers.

In 2023, became the Producer and Artistic Director of We Dance Production, Inc., significantly expanding the scale of the organization's work: the number of annual productions increased from 72 to 150+ shows per year, making the company one of the largest touring ballet organizations in North America.

Today Artem is the Founder and Artistic Director of the International Ballet Stars Grand North America Tour 2025-2026, bringing together dancers from over 12 countries, including Ukraine, Italy, Spain, Japan, France, Russia, Tajikistan, Moldova, Armenia, Brazil, the United Kingdom, and the United States.

International Ballet Stars have performed in some of the most prestigious theaters in the U.S., including the Music Hall in Detroit, Austin's Bass Concert Hall, Long Beach's Terrace Theater, San Diego's Balboa Theatre, and dozens of others.

Recognized for psychological resilience, leadership, deep knowledge of the classical repertoire, crisis management situations, ability to build world-class level professional ensembles, and unique skills in mentoring and developing dancers' artistic and technical potential.

Ekaterina Vaganova-Yachmennikova

Founder and Producer of International Ballet Stars

Ekaterina Vaganova-Yachmennikova graduated from the Moscow University of Culture, specializing in Promotion and Production of Cultural Public Programs. She began developing the We Dance Program in 2021 to include around 25 ballet studios participating in Classical Arts Entertainment productions. Under her leadership, the program has continued to expand, reaching 50 ballet Host Studios across the U.S. and Canada for the 2025–2026 season. This unique program allows ballet students of ages 5+ to perform with the professional ballet companies and gain a one-in-a-lifetime educational and cultural experience.

In 2023, Ekaterina became the co-producer and co-founder of We Dance Production, Inc., alongside Michael Art. They have grown the North America ballet tour from 72 to 150 performances across the United States, creating one of the largest classical ballet tours in North America. As a producer, she has been instrumental across multiple departments — from marketing and strategic planning to production coordination — and is presenting the International Ballet Stars Grand North America Tour 2025–2026, which will feature over 150 performances in the US & Canada.



Ekaterina's lifelong mission has been to popularize dance in all its forms. She began dancing at the age of 2.5 years and devoted 20 years to professional ballroom dance, earning titles such as three-time World Champion, two-time Champion of Russia, five-time Champion of Italy, Champion of Ukraine, and World Cup winner. She has also worked with celebrities as a teacher and choreographer in such TV formats, as Dancing With The Stars in Italy (2012–2017) on RaiUno channel, Dancing With The Stars in Russia (2009), and So You Think You Can Dance Russia (2015–2016) on TNT channel, working with stars like Bobo Vieri, Sergio Assisi, Kirill Pletnev, Valerio Aspromonte, Michele Morrone, Marco Del Vecchio, Bruno Cabrerizo, Anton Panufnik, and others. She was also part of the renowned TV format Midnight Run on Channel One Russia, performing alongside popular singers and presenters Alexey Chumakov and Timur Rodriguez, and hosting celebrities such as Alexey Yagudin, Viktoria Bonya, Dmitry Shepelev, Boris Moiseev, and many others.

As the owner of two dance studios We Dance Academies in Brevard County (2017–2022) with 250+ students, Ekaterina raised Florida and international dance champions and staged professional ballet productions. Ekaterina and Artem Yachmennikov founded and directed Melbourne City Ballet Theatre, producing landmark productions such as Swan Lake, Sleeping Beauty, and Cinderella at the King Center for the Performing Arts, which received widespread acclaim and grant support from the Brevard Cultural Alliance, Space Coast Office of Tourism, and the Florida Division of Cultural Affairs.
